

COVID-19 GRANTMAKING RESPONSE

The following nonprofits have received funding to support immediate effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. New grantees will be posted as additional grant funds are awarded.

TRI-CAP received a \$10,000 grant for direct assistance for utility, rent or mortgage payments for households that have been impacted economically by the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>GENERATIONS</u> received a \$5,000 grant in support of the Meals on Wheels program for Dubois County elderly and homebound due to COVID-19.

<u>DUBOIS COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT</u> received a \$2,000 grant for COVID-19 pandemic education and prevention efforts for the community through public service announcements (PSAs) on local media.

<u>HUMMINGBIRD DAY CARE</u> received a \$5,000 grant for operational support for food bills and other overhead expenses due to lost revenue during day care closure during the COVID-19 pandemic.

\$5,000 grant for enhanced client services including meal delivery to support individuals with disabilities isolated in order to stay protected from COVID-19.

<u>AMERICAN RED CROSS</u> received a \$5,000 grant to expand resources including additional staff for blood drive services in Dubois County that are in urgent demand due to a critical blood shortage caused by COVID-19.

<u>SHARED ABUNDANCE</u> received a \$5,000 grant in support of expenses related to increased food supply and operational expenses to offset the income lost from the Thrift Store closure during the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>A KID'S PLACE</u> received a \$10,000 grant for operational support due to lost revenue during day care closure during the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>SALVATION ARMY</u> received a \$5,000 grant for direct assistance for utility, rent or mortgage payments for households that have been impacted economically by the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>CRISIS CONNECTION</u> received a \$5,000 grant to purchase technology for Victim Advocates to work remotely throughout social distancing requirements and to continue to provide services to clients.

MENTORS FOR YOUTH received a \$6,000 grant to purchase technology for volunteers to virtually connect with their youth during this pandemic, including equipping volunteers who are bilingual to help Spanish speaking parents navigate through e-learning.

JASPER CHRISTIAN ACADEMY received a \$2,000 grant for operational support due to a significant decrease in revenue during the COVID-19 pandemic.

TRI COUNTY YMCA received a \$10,000 grant for operational support due to lost revenue during closure during the COVID-19 pandemic and to develop child care opportunities once re-opened.

MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AND HEALTH CARE CENTER received a \$25,000 grant to purchase sanitation equipment, including UV boxes and lamps, and technology to equip medical staff to virtually connect with their patients.
